After the close of the exhibition, and only after payment of the purchase price, the picture will be handed to the purchaser or his agent authorised in writing on application at 17 Carlton House Terrace, London SW1. The Council of the Society does not hold itself responsible for errors in prices and reserves the right to cancel a sale.

Any purchase effected by or with the artist direct must at once be notified to the Secretary and these rules complied with; otherwise a sale effected by the Society shall take precedence and supersede one made privately.

The copyright of each work in the Gallery is strictly reserved to the artist unless special agreement to the contrary is made. All reproduction rights are reserved.

Commissions

Commissions may be placed for works by artists showing in the Exhibition. Orders should be given to the receptionist at the desk for transfer to the Commissions Bureau.

Victoria by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, to all to whom these presents shall come, greeting:-

WHEREAS, under the auspices and patronage of our late Royal Uncle, Augustus Frederick Duke of Sussex, and of others of Our faithful and loving subjects, there was, in the year 1823, established in Our Metropolis of London, by divers others of Our faithful and loving subjects, being Artists, an Institution for the aid and

promotion of the Arts, entitled "The Society of British Artists," which has continued up to the present time; AND WHEREAS the

persons who have been, and now are Members of the said Society, have devoted much care, diligence, labour, and perseverance; and at their own private costs and charge incurred and expended considerable sums of money in the establishment and support of the said Institution; and the present Members of the said Society have humbly and dutifully besought Us to grant to them Our Royal Charter of Incorporation.

The following communication from the Home Office was received by the Society on August 9th, 1887:-

I am directed by the Secretary of State to inform you that he has had the honour to lay before the Queen the request of the Society of British Artists to be allowed to use the word "Royal" in connection with the title of the Society, and that Her Majesty was pleased to comply with the request, and to command that the Association shall be styled "The Royal Society of British Artists."

The extracts from the Society's Charter, together with the engraving of our former premises designed by Nash, speak for themselves and clearly establish the pedigree of the RBA and its importance in the History of British Art.

Since its formation in 1823 the Royal Society of British Artists has had 35 presidents which have included many distinguished painters such as J.MacNeill Whistler, Walter Richard Sickert and more recently the late Peter Greenham R.A., and the retiring President Colin Hayes R.A. I am honoured to have recently been elected the 36th president, and to have been entrusted by the membership together with the Officers and Council, with the responsibility and excitement of taking the Society into the new Millenium. I believe that the success of a society should not necessarily be measured by the number of works sold, but by its contribution to national debates, such as the current sad state of Fine Art Education at all levels. To this end I am proud that in September 1995 Northbrook College in Worthing, supported by the R.B.A. were sucessful in launching a new course based on figurative art studies which leads to a BA (Hons.) in Fine Art. This unique course enriched by visiting R.B.A. members is inundated with applications including many from overseas.

I further believe that those of us who have been blessed with talent and good health should spare a thought for those less fortunate. To this end during the period of my Presidency we have adopted 'Fight for Sight,' the U.K.'s leading charity in the battle against blindness. The two organisations are looking forward to planning a series of events during the next five years.

On behalf of the R.B.A. I would like to thank Jan Leeming, who is spearheading the 'Art for Sight's Sake' re-launch, for opening our 281st Exhibition. Finally, I dedicate the exhibition to Alan Coleman R.B.A., A.R.B.S., and Gordon Hale R.B.A., R.S.M.A. who sadly passed away during the last year. I am sure that they would have approved of the sincerity, diversity and quality of the work on show.
